Document #1 Sermon by Michele da Caraca, a Dominican friar, 1492


Images of the Virgin and Saints were introduced for three reasons.

- 1. People are simple and ignorant- those who are not able to read the scriptures can learn by seeing the sacraments of our salvation and faith in pictures
- 2. People are often emotionally sluggish- men who are not aroused to devotion when they hear about the histories of Saints may at least be moved when they see them, as if actually present, in pictures. For our feelings are aroused by things seen more than by things heard.
- 3. People have unreliable memories- many people cannot retain in their memories what they hear, but they do remember if they see images.
